In his book, Fred Trump also writes, "When my uncle was elected President, I recognized what a highly privileged position I would be in. I would have some access to the White House. And as long as that was true, I wanted to make sure I used that access for something positive. I was eager to champion something my wife, Lisa, and I were deeply passionate about, something we lived every day: the challenges for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families."

On the television show, "The View," co-host Sara Haines asked Fred Trump about his son, William. Haines said that William was born in 1999 with "a rare genetic disorder causing severe developmental and intellectual disabilities."

Haines then noted that Fred "spent years advocating for [William's] care, eventually lobbying Donald to establish a medical fund for William."

Then Haines added that this request led to a disturbing exchange between the two. Ultimately, Donald Trump declined to help his nephew and his nephew's son.

As I thought about this, I remembered how Donald Trump mocked a New York Times news reporter with cerebral palsy, when he started his campaign for president back in 2015. I thought this was shocking.

In fact, both these incidents reminded me of what I had learned researching the history of the Nazis with disabled people.

Both these incidents make me consider that Donald Trump may not have a place in his mind or his heart for those of us who are disabled.

## **KEVIN CONROY THE 1990S BATMAN**

He is vengeance, he is the knight, he's Kevin Conroy, the Batman of 1992. Kevin was born on November 30, 1955, in Westbury, New York. In 1973 he moved to New York City after he received a full scholarship to attend Juilliard School's drama division. There he studied under actor and director John Houseman and he was roomed with Robin Williams. He attended that school until he graduated in 1978. In 1980, after he had done his role in the daytime soap opera "Another World," he moved to California to improve himself on television. He even got better as a guest star on some shows such as "Cheers" and "Murphy Brown."

In 1992 he began his voice acting career in "Batman" the animated series as both Bruce Wayne and Batman, and he's been the voice of Batman on tv series, movies, and video games for 30 years. He even worked with some famous

actors such as Mark Hamill, Richard Moll, Michael Yolk, Loren Lester, and Melissa Gilbert. He even worked with the former Batman of the 1960s, Adam West who played Batman's favorite hero, the Gray Ghost, in the episode called "Beware the Gray Ghost." It was cool for those two Batmen to work together on that episode.

In 2016 during his interview in the New York Times he shared that he was gay, but it didn't matter to me because he had good voice acting and skills and the fans supported him on that. He continued his role as Batman until on November 10, 2022 he died at the Mount Sinal Hospital in New York City due to intestinal cancer at age of 66. To honor him, DC gave free online access to a Finding Batman story that he wrote about his life as part of the DC Comics 2022 Pride Anthology. But before he passed away, Kevin performed his final appearance as Batman in a new suicide squad game and a new DC movie that came out this year called "Justice League Crisis on Infinite Earths Part Three" as a cameo.

Although he's gone, he gave enough motivation to the fans to support the Batman franchise. Hopefully this year during the Batman 85th anniversary Warner Bros and DC Comics might do something to honor him alongside Adam West as a token for their roles as Batman throughout the years, like a documentary or making statues of them.

## SUNFLOWER PROGRAM

Starting Monday July 1, 2024, Nashville Airport will start being part of the Sunflower Program. The program helps people with hidden disabilities better move through the airport. People with hidden disabilities can pick up a lanyard with Sunflowers on it at the Information Center Desk. They do not have to say what their disability is. The airport — with lots of people, sounds, and lights — can be over stimulating for people with autism and other conditions. If a person is wearing the lanyard the airport employees know that they may need more time, patience or assistance getting to the plane.

There are more than 240 airports around the world who are in the Sunflower Program. The lanyard does not guarantee priority security screening or other special treatment, but this should help.

It's great how Indian people can come to see movies about their culture at my theater, something that isn't offered at a lot of local theaters on Long Island. They even take their kids to see the movies as an example of good representation in the media, which I'm proud of.

I've also seen lots of changes at my theater, not only with how different standees and posters decorate the theater, but with changes to how things work around there. This summer, Showcase removed the ice cream at the theater and replaced it with a space to make pretzels. At the same time, we also got Coke Freestyle machines, so customers could pick whatever soda they want. I wonder what the next few months working at the theater will bring for me, especially with the release of the Wicked movie, our next big release. I'll just have to see for myself!

Nelson Santiago is a painter. "The minute art was introduced to me by my family, I fell in love with it and never looked back! It kept me in focus on life, people, and my community of East Harlem, where many gifted artists were born and raised."

Julia Yepez uses a wheelchair. One looks at her she's like the proud grandmother next door, yet this woman is also a gifted artist. Her paintings are mostly clouds and the sun. "There's something about the sky often you don't get it right or wrong. You look up and say, 'I can make it to the top of the world."

Annalissa Rivera-Frantz is painter/poet. She does paintings of Afro, Latinos, Asians, as Super Heroines like Wonder Woman, Supergirl. "We don't stop shooting bullets, or smash thru walls, yet what we've accomplished it's almost like we are heroines. Remember this is real, not fiction"



Stefan, another co-founder along with Eli, stated, "I would love to see our work at these museums they talk about and read about. The Americans with Disabilities Act—we people with disabilities fought to get that law passed. That shows we are not only activists, we are also artists who love respect."

# DISABILITY RIGHTS GROUP SUES COUNTY OVER MASK BAN

In mid-August, Nassau County on Long Island banned people from wearing a mask in public. People can be fined up to \$1,000 or a year in jail. There are supposed to be exceptions for health and safety of the wearer and religious or cultural events, but there is no standard for the police to follow to decide. Disability Rights New York filed a lawsuit saying the mask ban violates the United States Constitution, The NY State Constitution, and the Americans with Disabilities Act. The Americans with Disabilities Act requires the government to provide disabled people with equal access to public services, programs, and activities.



Some disabled people who wear masks are afraid to go out in public because they aren't sure if they will be arrested or harassed by people in public.

Yelp worked with disability groups such as Disability:IN, the American Association of People with Disabilities, Open to All, and the ARC to make it easier for people to find businesses that can accommodate their needs.


